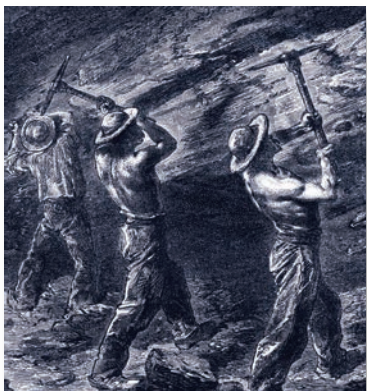

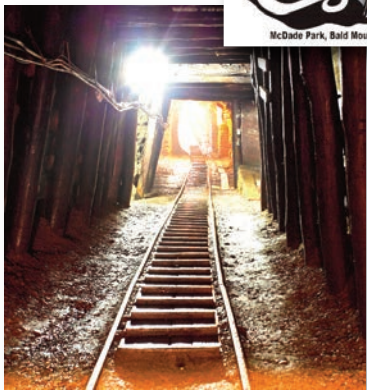

The Lackawanna Coal Mine Tour is open from April 1 through November 30, and is closed on Easter Sunday and Thanksgiving Day. The box office opens at 10:00 AM and the last tour departs between 2:30-3:00 PM. While waiting for your tour, watch a captivating video about deep mining in our theater located in the interpretive center. Please arrive no later than 2:45 PM to be scheduled for the final tour of the day.

Quick Facts

The descent down the slope takes 3-4 minutes. The walking portion of the tour is approximately a 1/2 mile and lasts one hour.

The temperature in the mine is 53° year round. A light jacket and comfortable shoes are recommended.

The mine is handicapped accessible with some restrictions. Please call or e-mail for specific limitations on accessibility.

Free parking is available by the main building.
