



- PA DOH confirmed as of 12:00 am, September 28, that there were 676 new cases, in addition to 918 new cases reported on Sunday, September 27 for a two-day total of 1,594 additional positive cases of COVID-19, bringing the statewide total to 156,826. There were 6 new deaths reported Sunday, September 27, and 1 new death reported for Monday, September 28 for a total of 8,107 deaths attributed to COVID-19.
- On September 28, PA DOH reported the statewide percent-positivity went down to 3.2% from 3.7% last week (a decrease of 1% over the last 2 weeks). Counties with concerning percent-positivity include Centre (12.0%). Northumberland (8.3%), Juniata (6.8%), Indiana (5.9%), Lebanon (5.7%), Snyder (5.2%), York (5.2). Based on this data, Centre and Northumberland counties have been identified as having "Substantial" levels of community transmission.
- As of September 28, the Allegheny County CBTS has tested **400 (+41)** people since testing began in McKeesport on September 15.
- As of September 28, the AMI Pop-up COVID-19 testing site in State College, Centre County, has tested **453** people since the site began testing on September 25.
- On September 28, Governor Wolf announced that Pennsylvania is prepared with a stockpile of personal protective equipment (PPE) should it be needed to fight the COVID-19 pandemic in the coming months. This PPE includes protective clothing, helmets, gloves, face shields, goggles, facemasks and respirators.

The Pennsylvania Department of Health today confirmed as of 12:00 a.m., September 28, that there were 676 new cases, in addition to 918 new cases reported on Sunday, September 27 for a two-day total of 1,594 additional positive cases of COVID-19, bringing the statewide total to 156,826. All 67 counties in Pennsylvania have cases of COVID-19.

There were 6 new deaths reported Sunday, September 27, and 1 new death reported for Monday, September 28 for a total of 8,107 deaths attributed to COVID-19. County-specific information and a statewide map are available on the [COVID-19 Data Dashboard](#).
